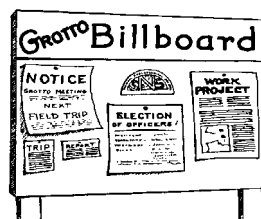

## Warm Springs Project - Hot Air Digs

### Jacob Whitlock reporting.

On March 28, 2026, a group of 9 cavers from RASS, the Blue Ridge Grotto, and the Warm Springs Project teamed up to work on the Hot Air Digs, which include 3 promising karst features that lie over the Conundrums section of Warm River Cave. The group met around 10:00am at Keith Sweeney's house to gear up and carpool to the dig sites.

The team included: Andrew Newton (RASS), Jacob Whitlock (RASS), Dave Socky (BRG, Warm Springs Project (WSP)), Amos Mincin (WSP), Jim Schurman (WSP), Bill Varjabedian (RASS), Elle Faye (RASS), Keith Sweeney (WSP), and Billy Pickett (RASS)

The group got to the dig sites at around 11:00 and began digging on the two digs that blow warm air. Amos and Jim primarily dug on Handstand Hole while the rest of the group stuck to the Audible Air Dig, and occasionally lent a hand to the Handstand Hole team.

With Jim hauling buckets, Amos widened the dig and began to follow a hole with good air running roughly southward and down. They removed a substantial amount of rock and clay, and built out a patio around the hole.

Using a variety of digging methods, the team progressed Audible Air about 8 feet, removing many buckets of rocks, but primarily handing large cobbles and boulders up the passage in an assembly line. Eventually, they could see the passage turn past a tight spot and continue, but they could not see past large cobbles

choking up the passage.

The sun was getting low, so the team decided to call it a day.

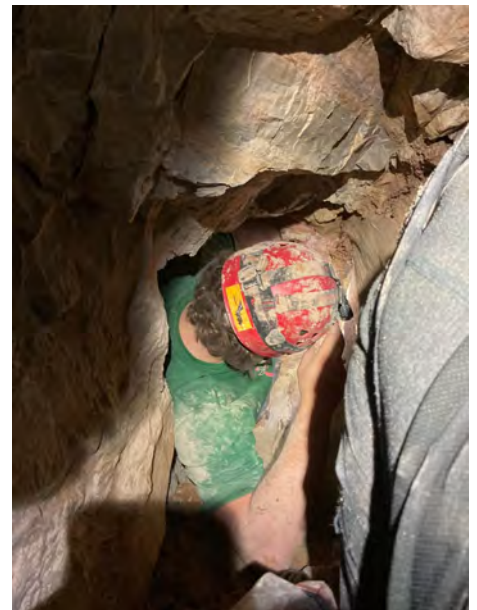
### Andrew Newton reporting.

On Saturday, April 4, 2026, Jacob Whitlock, Dave Socky, Andrew Newton, Mia Blyseth Connor Smith, and Eric Shuler arrived at Keith Sweeney's house at 10:00 AM and began work on the digs at 11:00, later joined by Christian Wheeler, Heather Kalish, Graham Boone, and Billy Pickett.

The two most promising digs so far have proven to be "Audible Air" and "Handstand Hole." Which both have a very strong **WARM** breeze emanating from their respective dig faces, as well as a very promising proximity to the conundrums section of Warm River Cave.

Quick progress was made on "Audible Air" with the lead progressing to a hard left turn into a tight ~10' deep tube akin to the culvert entrance in Pig Hole with some very uncomfortable obstructions. Eric was able to slither down, and the tube opened up to reveal two sloped breakdown rooms with a diggable crawlway headed in the direction of the conundrums section of WRC, which appears to be the source of our warm air (measured at 68°F). The body tube

proved quite uncomfortable to traverse, leading to some further passage improvements.

**Not Pictured:** Guttural howl Eric produced upon exiting the body tube. "WRC Howlin' Entrance" has a nice ring to it, doesn't it? ...Food for thought...

"Handstand Hole" also had a busy day, largely worked by Connor Smith, and Mia Blyseth. The hole managed to swallow a total of 7 straws, regurgitating a whopping 40 buckets of spoils. Speleo-theorization leads us to believe this hole shares an air connection with our other dig.

The WSP team packed up at 7:00 PM for a total of 9 hours, 8 of which were spent actively digging.

Plans for a return trip have been made for our usual 4th Saturday activities, the plan is further route improvement and to dig out the hot air crawlway.

On Sunday March 22, 2026, Nick Schmalenberger took Deneshia Ferraris and Bambi Marshall to Pig Hole Cave, VA.

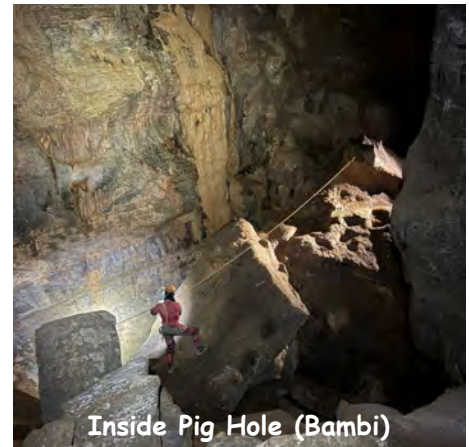

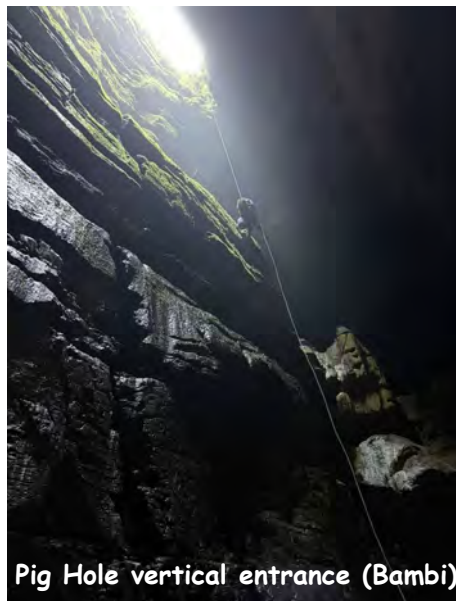
We arrived at Dope's Drop and found the fixed rope was missing, bummer, we wanted that rebelay.

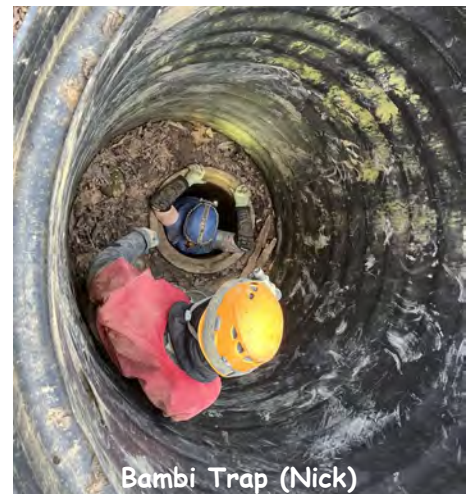

## Helictite Cave Trip Report

Participants included: Jeff Huffman, Susan Burr, Lauren Appel, Jessica Hester, Ben Hester, Nick Schmalenberger, Bambi Marshall, and Deneshia Ferraris.

This was our second visit to the Water Sinks Preserve, but this time we had a permit to go into *Helictite Cave*. WOW! Is a word to describe all the beautiful formations we saw.

With only a partial map of the cave we headed in. Our goal was to get into the Attic to see all the formations I remembered seeing on my first visit back in 2004. No one else on the trip had been in the Attic before. I kept telling them all about the room full of beautiful formations.

Not long after we got into the cave we got to see lots of formations & lots of the cave's namesake, helictites. Seems like every where we turned we saw more formations including some pretty cave pearls. We did reach our destination of the Attic. It just didn't look like what I had remembered. Jeff climbed up & described what he saw. It seemed like it just ended at the top of the

climb. Ben went up as well. Since they could not find a route into the Attic with all the formations without stepping on pure white calcite, they came down. I headed up next to see if I could figure it out or to confirm we were in the right spot. Jess came up behind me. I did go up to the top of where the second handline was. Still it looked impossible to go any further. We both took a bunch of pictures & headed back down. Going up in groups of 2, everyone went up. Next to where we were waiting for our turn climbing up, we saw a frog. I felt sorry for it since it looked so skinny & really no hope of ever getting out. There was even discussion on how we could get it out, but nothing really seemed feasible, so we left it. After everyone had a chance to climb up to the Attic, we headed back out while

exploring some other sections. I told the group I need to try to find out how to actually get into the Attic where all the formations are. I have pics of Phil Lucas & our group in there back in 2004.

Again on the way out we saw formations after formations. Once out of the cave we headed back stopping at the Upper Water Sinks area. Deneshia, Bambi & I got there before the others. Neither of them had been there before so I showed them the entrance to Subway Cave and we went and explored some of the Upper Water Sinks Cave. Out in the grassy area in front I started rolling over logs and we found some red-backed salamanders. About that time the others showed up. Then we headed back up the trail to the cars. Just as we were coming out of the woods into the open field I saw what I thought was a bird flying weird. I then noticed it looked like a bat. This was about 4:30pm. Everyone agreed it was a bat and it had a red appearance. That was kind of cool watching it fly around. Overall a fantastic trip!

This is probably the prettiest cave I have ever been in. 🦇

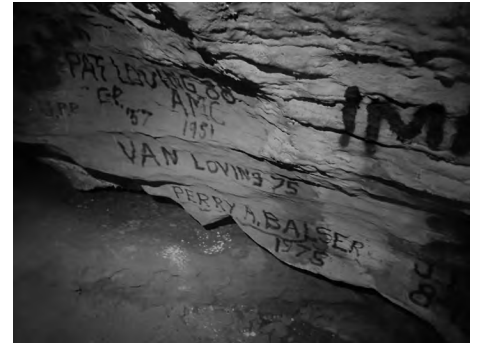

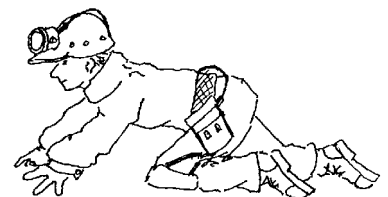

# Grotto Trip Log

**January:** Bambi Marshall, Bill Koerschner, and a bunch of other cavers attended the Hawaii Cave Conference in Hawaii. They explored lava tubes, did conservation work, and they saw **THE VOLCANO ERUPT!**

**2/14:** Bambi Marshall visited **Rusty's Cave, GA** – a 4-hour trip, and **Cemetery Pit** – Bambi stayed topside, watched the other cavers rig up and drop the pit.

**March?:** Scott Buchanan and other members of Charlottesville Grotto visited **McClung Cave, WV** via the Historic Entrance. Nice cave.

**3/7-14:** Scott Buchanan and Nick Schmalenberger attended the **NCRC Level 1 weeklong class** in Blacksburg, VA. (3/10) There was a mock rescue in **Tawney Cave, VA.** (3/13) There was also a mock rescue in **Smokehole, VA.** The water was flowing at stream level, but the patient stayed dry. They hauled him up and out the hilltop entrance. They also visited **James Cave, VA.** (3/11) The mud is still pucky & glass shards are everywhere at the other entrance.

**3/14:** Bambi Marshall and 10 members of Dogwood City Grotto spent seven hours in **Signal Light Cave**, outside of Chattanooga, TN. This is a vertical cave. They went to the Civil War Room and saw 1864 signatures.

**3/14:** **Benedicts Cave, WV.** Participants included David Socky, Nick Socky, Rob Wardell, Sunny Martin. This was the WVACS project weekend, but we ended up with only our team, although Riley Steinaker did one shot at the third entrance solo. We continued the survey downstream in Persinger Creek after doing a short loop. We got to the point where the passage turned into an army/belly crawl. This is a section that Riley had wanted to do, so we went back to where we started and surveyed into the right-hand lead (which leads to the rest of the cave). There were a couple of spots through formations which were tight, one of which was close to my limit. We surveyed until we got to a large intersection (West Virginia Turnpike was one of them). At this point, I took over as sketcher and Sunny was point. We surveyed around 1250 feet on a 10-hour trip. After we finished cleaning up loops in the junction room, we did a quick jaunt down a crawl to go check out the drop into the main cave. On the way we had to go down and traverse in a canyon and do some sketchy down climbs and up climbs with 15 to 20 feet of exposure. Webbing handlines would be really helpful at these two spots. The drop into big passage looked pretty easy and was about 30 feet deep.

**3/17:** **Marian** shared a visit to the **Catawba Murder Hole**, from the driveway: Dano and I were visited by Lowell (Dano's coworker), Valerie (his wife), Peggy (her Mom) and Gaius (their nephew).

**3/21:** BRG trip to **Lowmoor Cave, VA.** We split into 2 groups. **Susan Burr**, Jeff Huffman, etc. Brian Williams looked for, but could not find a very pretty pool he had seen while surveying the cave years earlier. The creek you have to drive across to enter the property was higher than ever seen before.

**3/28:** **Hot Air Digs, WSP, VA.** David Socky and the usual crew. See the article on page 24.

**4/4:** **Hot Air Digs, WSP, VA.** David Socky and the usual crew. We had a small breakout, but more digging required. See the article on page 24.

**4/8:** **Dogwood Cave and 3 new holes, VA.** David Socky, Bill Koerschner, Joe Zokaites, Keith Sweeney, Jim Schurman, and Rick Lambert. Dave dropped the pit in Dogwood Cave to recover a temperature logger that a cave rat had gotten into. While Dave futzed around in Dogwood, Bill (being bored) found 3 new holes to explore and survey. We spent the rest of the day worked on these new pits - one of which still goes. 🐿
